All that was needed was the workers.

This year we also had a camp meeting in the Playon Chico community. We thank all those who supported us, friends, pastors, and the congregations that participated this year. We were able to baptize some brothers and sisters, thanks to God. This camp meeting was tremendous during the three days we were in Playon Chico. We thank God for our missionary friends who supported this camp meeting. While Papa Neil couldn't make it this year, God sent other friends to support us. Charles Edwards, Rebekah Edwards, Anna Edwards, and Brother Nathan Snow and Mindy Snow. I thank God for these men of God who supported the work this year.



Let us pray that God will provide for the Mamitupu church soon. The brothers are without a church building and only worship in the pastor's house. In the meantime, they have not given up, growing in the Lord's grace. Due to the deterioration of the church structure, they had to tear down the church. Before we lament, we are still waiting for God's provision to complete the work and begin the construction of a new church.



We also supported those who lost their homes in the fire in the community of Dubuala this year. I want to show you some photos of the support we were able to provide, thanks to God, with the support of Papa Neil, we were able to bring help to people who needed a helping hand in difficult times.



I want you to pray so we can continue doing God's work in the midst of difficult times we've experienced in recent years. Here we send you information about the work being done by the churches in Kuna Yala. This doesn't contain photos of all the churches; we'll be posting more photos of the work later. I want to express my gratitude to all the pastors of the Guna Yala region. Let's continue moving forward in the work. It's been difficult for me to visit all of you this year. Due to the lack of a pastor at the Tabernacle of Holiness, I've remained pastoring these years. But I haven't stopped thinking about you. Today I don't understand everything, but God knows what He's doing. It's been very difficult for me to stay in one place. God knows the calling I feel is stronger in the countryside.

This year we were able to repair the roofs of the churches on Isla Raton & Aidirgandi & Naranjo Grande & missing. Mamitupu & Playon Chico, and soon at Corazon de Jesus, it's in progress. Thank you to everyone who supports the work. May God bless you and keep you.

I also ask everyone to pray for Pastora Luisa, who is in Panama due to failing health, so that she recovers soon.
